

Hospitals and their staffs are once more being overwhelmed and are unprepared for what is occurring the death rate is climbing again, as well.


About 80 percent of new COVID-19 cases in the U.S. can be attributed to this strain.



Swap & Helping Hands Board



Did You Know?

- Equinoxes are opposite on either side of the equator, so the autumnal (fall) equinox in the Northern Hemisphere is the spring (vernal) equinox in the Southern Hemisphere and vice versa.
- On the two equinoxes every year the Sun shines directly on the Equator and the length of day and night is nearly equal – but not exactly.
- The September equinox marks the moment the Sun crosses the celestial equator – the imaginary line in the sky above the Earth's equator – from north to south and vice versa in March.
- In the Northern Hemisphere, the fall equinox marks the first day of fall (autumn) in what we call astronomical seasons. There's also another, more common definition of when the seasons start, namely meteorological definitions, which are based on average temperatures rather than astronomical events.



Liturgy Committee -



Although, the calendar date tends to change each year, you can always count on showing off those "grilling skills" during the first weekend of September.









Maybe they should call us AIREDALE RESPONDERS!





Recipe submitted by Mary Anderson


Ingredients

- ½ tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. soda mixed with 1 c. sour milk
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 4 to 5 cups apples or rhubarb
- ¾ c. sugar mixed with ¾ tsp cinnamon
- ½ c. nuts (optional)

DIRECTIONS

Cream together sugar and oleo. Add eggs, flour, sour milk mixed with soda, salt and vanilla. Mix well and add apples or rhubarb. Mix. Bake in a greased 9x13 inch pan, 350 degrees for 45 minutes. Sprinkle sugar and cinnamon on top of warm cake. Enjoy!
