



Did You Know? About Transfiguration

See: Luke 9. 28-36

- There is no transfiguration in the Gospel of John.
- All three Synoptic accounts place this immediately after Peter's confession of Jesus at Caesarea Philippi, where Jesus then starts to talk about his betrayal and death.
- Later at Gethsemane...John then talks of having seen [Jesus's] glory (John 1.14) and 2 Peter 1.17. 18 also includes testimony to this incident.
- Luke is alone in specifying that Jesus took the three with him to pray; prayer is one of the distinctive focuses of Luke's narrative.
- The three Synoptics vary considerably in the exact language that they use to describe Jesus's appearance; it is difficult to know what it would have looked like had we been there and filmed it on our iPhone, but what the gospel writers want us to know is its significance.
- The account of their conversation in Luke 9.31. 33 is unique to the third gospel.
- Luke moves on to the next episode of Jesus's ministry, but both Matthew and Mark fill out the details of the disciples' puzzlement. They still do not understand the significance of this vision or insight- and indeed, they will not until they have begun to make sense of Jesus's death and resurrection.

And so it begins—


I sure do hope that the next units to be installed will come with little blinking no vacancy signs+so that our friends seek other housing elsewhere.



 Look for it to be posted on the Church's Facebook page.



The Transfiguration!

Jesus took three of his disciples, Peter, James, and John, (his inner circle) high up on a mountain, where Moses and Elijah appeared and Jesus was transfigured, his face and clothes becoming dazzlingly bright (Mark 9:2–13; Matthew 17:1–13; Luke 9:28–36).

To be transfigured is to be changed in form or appearance, to go through some kind of a metamorphosis, to go through an exalting, glorifying, or spiritual change.

The Transfiguration is a pivotal moment, and the setting on the mountain is presented as the point where human nature meets God: the meeting place for the temporal and the eternal, with Jesus himself as the connecting point, acting as the bridge between heaven and earth.

Presidents' Day!

Presidents' Day for the year 2022 is celebrated/ observed on Monday, February 21st.

President's Day, also known as "Washington's Birthday," is on the third Monday of February each year and is a federal holiday in the United States. The day not only honors George Washington (born February 22), the first President of the United States, and Abraham Lincoln (born February 12) whose birthdays are both in February, but honors ALL the presidents who have served in the United States.

Uniform Monday Holiday Act

On June 28, 1968 the United States Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act [1] changing many federal holidays to move over to Monday from other days of the week.

Originally Washington's Birthday was celebrated on February 22nd each year but was permanently moved in 1968 with the signing of the new Act. So the new date of President's Day will fall between February 15 and the 21st each year and never on his (Washington's) actual birthday of February 22nd.

Liturgy Committee – “Thank you All Saints”

As you read this, I will have completed my 3-year term as a member of council, vice president and most recently, Acting President of All Saints Church Council. It's been an interesting 3 years, not always fun but also often rewarding to see the ways that my service has impacted the church, hopefully for the better. Being a part of the decision-making group during a pandemic is unnerving as there is very little precedent by which to make decisions. I am grateful that the changes that we enacted and our ability, as a church, to roll with the punches has helped to keep our church open when so many have closed.

Reflecting back on my time on church council, I think about some of the decisions and activities that I was personally involved in. I am grateful to have been able to offer the drive-by communion service for much of 2020 and all of 2021 for those members who did not feel safe attending liturgy in large groups. This service further demonstrated our ability to meet people where they were and make sure that people who might be feeling isolated by the pandemic have the opportunity to participate in worship. I was grateful to participate in the decorating of our church for worship over the last two years as the council person in charge of the Liturgy committee. Learning about the various paraments, banners and worship components has been eye-opening! The effort that goes into decorating for Advent and Christmas alone is overwhelming and it has given me a much greater appreciation for those who have participated in this committee for many years. I am excited to see the new flooring go in (currently being installed while I write this - hopefully you have all had a chance to see it by the time you read this!) Seeing this major improvement in a place that I love is special because it reflects the importance of stewardship and taking care of our church home. Addressing how we allow others to use our space through rentals has been an arduous process but one that needs to be addressed as we protect the building that houses our worship.

The conversations that have gone into the decisions that we made haven't always been easy and at times, left me feeling frustrated. But, like every difficult family conversation, they are necessary to ensure that the family function runs as smoothly as possible and the decisions made are what is best for the family and the home. And that is ultimately what All Saints is . my church family and the building, my church home. I am grateful to have served . will probably do it again someday after taking a much needed (and deserved) break from my community service. But I hope, like always, to continue seeing everyone in church and at craft fairs and all the other special events that draw us together as a family!

MEMBERSHIP

Members of this congregation shall be those baptized persons on the roll of this congregation at the time that this constitution is adopted and those who are admitted thereafter and who have declared and maintain their membership in accordance with the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws.

Members shall be classified as follows: **Baptized members** are those persons who have been received by the Sacrament of Holy Baptism in this congregation, or, having been previously baptized in the name of the Triune God, have been received by certificate of transfer from other Lutheran congregations or by affirmation of faith.

Confirmed members are baptized persons who have been confirmed in this congregation, those who have been received by adult baptism or by transfer as confirmed members from other Lutheran congregations, or baptized persons received by affirmation of faith.

Voting members are **confirmed members**. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation.

Members of this congregation who have satisfied these **basic standards** shall have the privilege of **voice and vote** at every regular and special meeting of this congregation as well as the other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws.




The Property Gal





Garlic Beef Enchiladas

 Total Time Prep: 30 min. Bake: 40 min.


 Makes 5 servings

Ingredients

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/4 teaspoon rubbed sage
- 1 can (14-1/2 ounces) stewed tomatoes, cut up

SAUCE:

- 1/3 cup butter
- 4 to 6 garlic cloves, minced
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 can (14-1/2 ounces) beef broth
- 1 can (15 ounces) tomato sauce
- 1 to 2 tablespoons chili powder
- 1 to 2 teaspoons ground cumin
- 1 to 2 teaspoons rubbed sage
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 10 flour tortillas (6 inches), warmed
- 2 cups shredded Colby-Monterey Jack cheese, divided
- Optional toppings: Halved grape tomatoes, minced fresh cilantro, sliced jalapeno peppers, chopped or sliced red onion and cubed avocado



Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a large skillet, cook beef and onion over medium heat until beef is no longer pink, 6-8 minutes, breaking meat into crumbles; drain. Stir in flour and seasonings. Add tomatoes; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer, covered, 15 minutes.
2. In a saucepan, heat butter over medium-high heat. Add garlic; cook and stir 1 minute or until tender. Stir in flour until blended; gradually whisk in broth. Bring to a boil; cook and stir until thickened, about 2 minutes. Stir in tomato sauce and seasonings; heat through.
3. Pour 1-1/2 cups sauce into an ungreased 13x9-in. baking dish. Place about 1/4 cup beef mixture off center on each tortilla; top with 1-2 tablespoons cheese. Roll up and place over sauce, seam side down. Top with remaining sauce.
4. Bake, covered, until heated through, 30-35 minutes. Sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake, uncovered, until cheese is melted, 10-15 minutes longer. Serve with toppings as desired.




