

Confirmation Requirements

(Effective September 2016)

1. Each student will volunteer for a minimum of 5 service hours over the course of the confirmation class year. Students may volunteer for more than 5 hours, and are encouraged to do so, but are not limited to, fall/spring cleanup, mail carriers food drive, Easter breakfast and processions, ushering, greeting, lecturing, etc.
Each student must maintain an annual log of hours that will be turned in to the pastor at the end of the confirmation class year. Each log entry must be signed off by the leader of the event.
2. Each student will complete an annual exam covering only the material taught during their current confirmation class year. Each student must achieve a minimum score of 90% on the open book, open note, exam prior to the start of the next confirmation class year. Students will take the annual exam during class time of the second to the last class of the confirmation class year. If a student's score is below the minimum required score, he/she will take an additional exam, containing only the incorrectly answered questions, during class time of the last class of the confirmation class year. If the minimum score is still not obtained, the student must achieve the minimum score before

the beginning the next confirmation class year. If a student is not present to take the exam, the pastor will contact the student and/or student's parent/sponsor. If there is no response to the pastor, a follow up call will be made by a representative of the Christian Education committee. To be eligible to be confirmed, each student must pass an exam every confirmation class year attended and fulfill the required service hours.

3. Parents or an adult sponsor would be asked to support their Confirmand in the following ways:
 - a. Ensure students take and pass all exams
 - b. Ensure students fulfill service hours
 - c. Contact the pastor in the event of an absence from class (Student's responsibility . PJ's private line: 762-6101) or Church line . 414-762-5111
 - d. Bring their student to liturgy for Worship
 - e. If comfortable for the student, attend a confirmation class with him/her. (parents are always welcome!)

(Note: Special accommodations can be made with the pastor's consultation and approval)
