# **President's Article**

Attending the 2023 Greater Milwaukee Synod Assembly provided a wonderful opportunity to meet some of the leaders of "other ELCA congregations" in the area. Conversations with them were truly memorable.

Presentations at the assembly covered Lutheran Social Service Programs, the Global Mission Appeal, and Diversity and Inclusion.

During dinner, our "Keynote Speaker" spoke of his work with communities that have experienced trauma as a result of hate crimes. He also told of his work with the perpetrators to help them deal with their anger.

After dinner and more conversation, we moved to another large hall for a liturgy of worship. The hymns were especially notable, with hundreds of voices supporting each other. Rev. Kenneth Wheeler provided a stirring sermon. We ended with communion.

On the second day, we were assigned different tables, so that we met more people. There were planned discussion sessions, so we exchanged ideas and information throughout the morning.

Later we heard reports from Bishop Paul Erickson and Synod Vice President, Joyce A. Caldwell.

We passed five resolutions. The first involved caring for the environment. The second suggested raising the age at which juveniles can be tried as adults. The third increased the amount of money set aside for Pastor's Continuing education. New guidelines are to be set as well. The fourth established a compensation guidelines committee. The fifth involved adding language to the constitution that gives increased attention to children and youth, especially those at risk. We also approved several constitutional amendments and passed a budget for 2024/2025.



# **SYNOD ASSEMBLY 2023 RECAP**

The Greater Milwaukee Synod (GMS) is a geographic grouping of congregations, extending from Sheboygan down to the Illinois border and from Lake Michigan to the western edge of Waukesha County. We are one of 65 synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA).

This synod is made up of 115 congregations, 4 Synod Authorized Worshiping Communities, and 59,143 baptized members in southeastern Wisconsin led by Bishop Paul D. Erickson and a 17-member synod council.

The Fourth of July, also known as "Independence Day," marks the historic date in 1776 when the "Declaration of Independence" was approved by the Continental Congress.

The written declaration stated that the American colonies were tired of being ruled by Great Britain and wanted to become their own country. On July 2nd, 1776, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence and two days later delegates from the 13 colonies adopted the "Declaration of Independence," a historic document drafted by Thomas Jefferson.

In the event that you may have forgotten, these are the "Original Thirteen Colonies": Virginia, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New York, Maryland, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Delaware, North Carolina, South Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Georgia. This is also their order numerically listed from the first to the last received…1607-1732.

There were an estimated 2.5 million people living in the original thirteen colonies in 1776.



**SAVE THE DATE! Outdoor liturgy and cookout- September 10!** More info to come in August. Have you noticed that recently during communion PJ is not holding the plate with the wafers? That he is holding a chalice-like thing?

The chalice-like thing (in some sets it is smaller and box-like) is called a Ciborium or Host Box. It has a lid (which he leaves on the altar during communion), and it is what the consecrated Hosts are stored in.

The "plate" which we had been using for quite a while, is called a paten. Did you also know that there is a smaller plate or paten that rests on top of the chalice when it is "dressed"?

The Chalice, Host Box and small paten currently being used on Sunday's and some Saturday's, is a set which was donated by church member Vernice Draving on the second anniversary of her teenage son Jim's untimely passing. Go ahead and take a quick peek at the set up after liturgy is over. If you are in church on Wednesday or a Saturday when the ceramic host box and paten are used, the chalice being used is the one that PJ brought back from Jerusalem in 1981. It is made of olive wood.

Average attendance at liturgies is as follows...

For the month of April: Wednesday – 8, Saturday- 22, Sunday- 60.

May: Wednesdays – 10, Saturdays – 18, Sundays – 39.

Please note that these numbers include PJ and Kinga/Peggy.

# **Mary Magdalene**

Mary Magdalene has been a victim of mistaken identity for almost 20 centuries.

Except for the mother of Jesus, few women are more honored in the Bible than Mary Magdalene. Yet she could well be "the patron saint of the slandered," since there has been a persistent legend in the Church that she is the unnamed sinful woman who anointed the feet of Jesus in Luke 7:36-50.

Most scholars would say, "Not so!" But the tradition continues...in spite of the best of knowledge.

The precise dates of her birth and death are unknown, but we do know she was present with Christ during his public ministry, death, and resurrection. She is mentioned at least a dozen times in the Gospels.

Mary Magdalene has long been regarded as a prostitute or sexually immoral in Western Christianity, but this is not supported in the scriptures.

It is believed she was a Jewish woman who lived among Gentiles, living as they did.

The Gospels agree that Mary was originally a great sinner. Jesus cast seven demons out of her when he met her.

Her day is and always has been July 22<sup>nd</sup>, the date on which she is celebrated in church.

# **Christian Stewardship**



# Ingredients

- 2 packages (8 ounces each) cream cheese, softened.
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon almond extract
- 2 cups heavy whipping cream, whipped.
- 2 guarts strawberries, halved, divided.
- 2 quarts blueberries, divided.




#### **Directions**

Top with another third of the cream mixture and the remaining berries. Spread the remaining cream mixture on top. Use the reserved strawberries and blueberries to make a "flag" on top.


We also have gluten free wafers available, but you need to let Pj know before the liturgy if you wish them available for communion.
