Comment Article: The Season of the Spirit, life in the church...



The season of Pentecost, the longest season of our Christian calendar is about to be upon us...it goes on seemingly forever.

Traditionally, Christians celebrate the day of Pentecost as a feast commemorating the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ, as described in the Book of Acts 2:1–31.

Worship on this day, usually brings with it, the readings of our lessons in various foreign tongues...this year we have some" new tongues" to throw into our mixture.

We have had Spanish, ASL (American Sign Language), and Polish, and Hebrew, and French all before...A creole language, *Hawaiian Pidgin* (or Hawaii Creole English, HCE), is more commonly spoken in Hawai'i than Hawaiian! What if we were to throw a little Pidgin into our mix? Years ago it was common to have Finnish or Swedish or German. What if we were to add Filipino or Tagalog this year?

During this year's celebration we have the convergence of Memorial Day weekend along with the Day of Pentecost both at the same time. Expect flags and military displays and Taps on the trumpet... and the Missing Man Table...

And then, we are throwing in some "Brass music" just to liven up our celebration!

You never quite know what you will get when you worship at ASLC. It is always fun to see the faces on visitors, who cannot figure just what is going on...

Kind of like when we wish everybody a Happy New Year in November, early December...some people still do not get it!!!

Since Pentecost follows the season of Easter, it occurs during the spring, and the rebirth of flora and fauna remind us of the beauty and wonder of our magnificent God.

At All Saints, we customarily celebrate the conclusion of our confirmation course of study on or near Pentecost Sunday. The Rite of Reaffirmation of Baptismal Promises always takes place on either All Saints Day or All Saints Sunday. We also look forward to the celebration of First Communion on that date as well...

The liturgical color for the actual Sunday of Pentecost, which you will see on the altar (the paraments) and on the stole and chasuble that the pastor wears, is red.

However, the liturgical color for the remainder of the season of Pentecost is green. Green usually symbolizes growth and life in the spirit.

Just what else will the SEASON OF PENTECOST hold in store for us? You have to come and check it out...



The Athanasian Creed



Quicumque Vult - this phrase is the title attributed to what is popularly known as the Athanasian Creed.

It was often called the Athanasian Creed because for centuries people attributed its authorship to Athanasius, the great champion of Trinitarian orthodoxy during the crisis of the heresy of Arianism that erupted in the fourth century.

That theological crisis focused on the nature of Christ and culminated in the Nicene Creed in 325.

Though Athanasius did not write the Nicene Creed, he was its chief champion against the heretics who followed after Arius, who argued that Christ was an exalted creature but that He was less than God.

Athanasius died in 373 AD, and the epithet that appeared on his tombstone is now famous, as it captures the essence of his life and ministry.

It read simply, "Athanasius contra mundum," that is, "Athanasius against the world."

This great Christian leader suffered several exiles during the embittered Arian controversy because of the steadfast profession of faith he maintained in Trinitarian orthodoxy.

Though the name "Athanasius" was given to the creed over the centuries, modern scholars are convinced that the Athanasian Creed was written after the death of Athanasius.

Certainly, Athanasius' theological influence is embedded in the creed, but in all likelihood, he was not its author.



Did You Know?

(About John the Baptizer!)

- He is one of most significant and well-known figures in the entire Bible.
- While John was known as "THE Baptizer" he was in fact, the first prophet called by God since Malachi, some four hundred years earlier.
- He was a Judean preacher active in the area of the Jordan River in the early first century.
- He is attested to by the Historian, Josephus.
- He has been known historically as the FORERUNNER in Christianity.
- In some circles he was known as being John, the immerser.
- He is sometimes alternatively and incorrectly referred to as John the Baptist.
- It has been said that with the beginning of John's ministry a new era has begun.
- His feast day is June 24th.
- John had his own circle of disciples or students...that followed him.
- All four Gospels recognize in John the start of the Christian era.
- John was born into a priestly family.
- His formative years were spent in the Judaean desert, where monastic communities, such as the Essenes (a strict Jewish sect that existed from about the 2nd century BCE to the end of the 1st century CE), and individual hermits often educated the young in their own ideals.
- His mission was addressed to all ranks and stations of Jewish society.
- His message was that God's judgment on the world was imminent and that, to prepare for this judgment, the people should repent their sins, be baptized, and produce appropriate fruits of repentance.





HOLY TRINITY

Trinity, in Christian doctrine, the unity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit as three persons in one Godhead. The doctrine of the Trinity is considered to be one of the "central Christian affirmations about God." It is rooted in the fact that God came to meet Christians in a threefold figure: as Creator, Lord of the history of salvation, Father, and Judge, as revealed in the Hebrew Bible; as the Lord who, in the incarnated figure of Jesus Christ, lived among human beings and was present in their midst as the "Resurrected One"; and as the Holy Spirit, whom they experienced as the helper or intercessor in the power of the new life.

Neither the word "Trinity" nor the explicit doctrine appears in the Early Christian Writings, nor did Jesus and his followers intend to contradict the Shema in the Hebrew Scriptures: "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord."

The earliest Christians, however, had to cope with the implications of the coming of Jesus Christ and of the presumed presence and power of God among them... the Holy Spirit, whose coming was connected with the celebration of Pentecost. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit were associated in such Early Christian Writing passages as the Great Commission: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" and in the apostolic benediction: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all."

Thus, the Early Christian Writings established the basis for the doctrine of the Trinity.

Council Capsules from May 15th, 2023, meeting:

- A motion was approved to allow the finance committee to look at the breakdown of costs associated with running three liturgies each week and report these findings back to the council.
- A motion was approved to welcome Myrna Farrell to the congregation.
- A motion was approved to appoint Helen Haworth to attend the ELCA Synod assembly in place of Lynn Friedman who was appointed at the annual meeting but is no longer able to attend.

Additionally, the council discussed repair of the parking lot and are still awaiting bids before making a decision and beginning the repairs later this year. In addition, Worship and Music will review the old CPIC sheets and make recommendations to the council on what CPIC duties will continue and which are being done by their committee.


First Communion:

The Holy Trinity

There are two stories of when the first Father's Day was celebrated. According to some accounts, the first Father's Day was celebrated in Washington STATE on June 19th, 1910. A woman by the name of Sonora Smart Dodd came up with the idea of honoring and celebrating her father while listening to a Mother's Day sermon at church in the year 1909.

She felt as though mothers were getting all the acclaim while fathers were equally deserving of a day of praise.

Sonora's dad was apparently quite the guy! He was a veteran of the Civil War, was left a widower when his wife died while giving birth to their sixth child. He went on to raise all six children by himself on their small farm in Washington.


To show her appreciation for all the hard work and love her father gave to her and to her siblings, Sonora thought there should be a day to pay homage to him and to other dads like him. She initially suggested June 5th the anniversary of her father's death to be the designated day to celebrate Father's Day, but due to some bad planning, the celebration in Spokane, Washington was deferred to the third Sunday in June.

THE OTHER STORY...

Happened in Fairmont, West Virginia on July 5th, 1908. Grace Golden Clayton suggested to the minister of the local Methodist church that they hold services to celebrate fathers after a deadly mine explosion killed 361 men.

While Father's day was celebrated locally in several communities across the country, unofficial support to make the celebration a national holiday began almost immediately. William Jennings Bryant was one of its staunchest proponents. In 1924, President Calvin (Silent Cal) Coolidge recommended that Father's Day became a national holiday. But no official action was taken.

In 1966, Lyndon B. Johnson, through an executive order, designated the third Sunday in June as the official day to celebrate Father's Day. However, it wasn't until 1972, during the Nixon Administration, that Father's Day was officially recognized as a national holiday!

Communion




