



This is a heartfelt THANK YOU from your financial secretary at Church.

For the 2023 Giving Year, I have taken over the role of inputting your weekly GIVING contributions in a new upgraded Software system in the Cloud. We did a major upgrade in March of 2023. Since then, I have entered your weekly contributions in a new database. I am still learning the ins and outs of the system but it's a very nice system. Rest assured, it is backed up and is Safe and Secure!


I just want to update you on how it works and extend some thanks for your help.

- To the money counters.
 - Thank you for attaching the envelopes to the sheet they are applied to. This has really HELPED to simplify the weekly entry into the system. During the process, I balance each envelope to the sheet AND TO THE DEPOSIT SLIP created by the money counter team leader. It all has to balance perfectly.
 - Please be sure when you enter an amount on the 'sheet' for an envelope that the
 envelope is also marked with the amount that was found in the envelope. This step is
 needed to balance each entry.
- To the congregation.
 - Please put the amount you are putting in the envelope on the outside of the envelope.
 This is for insurance reasons and balancing 'the books'
 - ENVELOPES FOR THE WEEK, and SIMPLY GIVING donations, regardless of which service you attend, (Wednesday, Saturday, or Sunday) or day of the week you do SIMPLY GIVING are accumulated for the week and entered in a 'batch' for the SUNDAY date ending that week. This means your contribution statements will all reflect a giving DATE of a Sunday even if you attend a different day or give a different day.
 - I cannot backdate a giving envelope or forward date it.
 - As an example, some people 'catch up' with envelopes if they are out of town or will be out of town and put 2 or 3 or more in at a time, back or forward dated. I can only enter the date for the week that the deposit is made. So, you can save paper and envelopes by just catching up with one envelope and putting the total amount in one. It's fine either way!

We sure hope the veterans and their families enjoyed the food! It was a good experience...and just another way that your church cares about others and reaches out...



The Reformation movement began essentially on October 31, 1515, the Eve of All Saints Day when Martin Luther posted "a list of grievances," called the Ninety-Five Theses, against the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. Although he had become uncomfortable with many church teachings, what fundamentally spurred him to action was an incident that occurred when a friar named TETZEL (who was selling indulgences issued by the Pope, to acquire the finances needed and necessary to add an addition to St. Peter's) made his way to Germany. Luther took offense against this doctrine of the church. In his theses, he reviewed ninety-five points in which the Church had erred in its interpretation of the Early Christian Writings. He touched on major teachings of the Church, including the Sacrament of Penance, Transubstantiation, and Papal Authority. Luther claimed that what distinguished him from previous reformers was that while they attacked the corruption in the life of the Church, he went to the "theological root of the problem" --- the perversion of the church's doctrine or redemption and grace. Luther, a pastor, and professor at the University of Wittenberg, deplored the entanglement of God's free gift of grace in a complex system of indulgences and good works. He proposed an ethical and theological reform of the church: SCRIPTURE ALONE is authoritative (SOLA SCRIPTURA), and justification is by faith (SOLA FIDE), not by works. While he did not intend to break with the Catholic Church, a confrontation with the papacy was not long in coming.



Thank you to everyone for supporting our youth group!



All Saints' Day is celebrated on November 1st in Western Christianity and the first Sunday following Pentecost in Eastern Christianity.

All Saints' Day is also known as All Hallows, Solemnity of All Saints, Hallowmas, and Feast of Saints.

The liturgical color of All Saints' Day is white.

The first All Saints' Day was celebrated in Rome in May of 609, under Pope Boniface IV.

Some believe that All Saints' Day is the result of Greek Christian tradition from the 4th century when a festival was held to honor saints and martyrs on the Sunday following Pentecost.

Pope Gregory IV made All Saints' Day a holiday in 837.

Mexico celebrates All Saints' Day with a week-long celebration. This celebration includes festivals, parades, and dances.

The football team called the New Orleans Saints was given its name because of New Orleans' large Catholic Church population.


Some All Saints' Day feasts include Irish bread with fruit, soul cakes, and cabbage served with boiled potatoes.

Symbols that are commonly associated with All Saints' Day include images of specific saints, the crown, the hand of God, and a sheaf of wheat.

In some countries such as Poland, Philippines and in France, people visit the graves of their loved ones on All Saints' Day to make repairs or clean the graves.

All Saints' Day is a public holiday in Austria, Belgium, Bolivia, Chile, Croatia, France, Hungary, Italy, Liechtenstein, the Philippines, Poland, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, and in some parts of Switzerland and Germany.

All Saints' Day is not a nationwide public holiday in Canada, the U.S., the U.K., or Australia, but it is still observed by many Christians in these countries.



All Saints Sunday is the Sunday closest to November 1st following Reformation Day!



Potato Puff Casserole

Ingredients:

- 1 lb. ground beef
- ½ cup chopped onion
- 1/3 cup chopped green pepper
- 1 tbsp chili sauce or ketchup
- 1 can (10 ¾ oz) condensed cream of mushroom soup
- ¼ cup water
- 1 package (10 oz) frozen potato puffs

Directions:

In skillet combine ground beef, onion, and green pepper. Cook over medium heat, breaking up meat with fork, until meat is browned, and onion and pepper are tender.

Add chili sauce, undiluted soup, and water.

Turn into 1 ½ quart casserole dish. Cover top with frozen potato puffs.

Bake, uncovered, at 375 degrees for 35 minutes or until potato puffs are golden brown.

Makes 4 servings.

The little boy opened the back door a little and said


"Lord if you're out there, hand me the broom".
