Did You Know?

- When you think about it, it's kind of strange that fall is the only time of year with two names: spring, summer, and winter each only have one name, while fall is also known as autumn. The season once had a third name as well—in 12th- and 13th-century Middle English, fall was called "haerfest," which was the act of taking in crops. Eventually, it was known as "harvest" because the full moon closest to the autumn equinox is called the harvest moon.
- After fall was known as "harvest," it eventually can be called "autumn"—so how did "fall" become the dominant term? In the early 1600s, people started moving into cities, and use of the term "harvest" lessened. They started saying "fall of the leaf" to refer to the third season of the year, because the leaves would fall from the trees. Over time, "fall of the leaf" was shortened to "fall," and it stuck.
- Fall leaf colors are caused by certain pigments in the leaves, and different kinds of trees
 produce different pigments. When you notice leaves that are purple and red, that's caused by
 the "anthocyanins" pigment, which is only produced in the fall when sugars are trapped in the
 leaves. Lots of dry weather and sunlight will lead to more sugars in the leaves, meaning the
 leaves will be brighter red. Freezing, meanwhile, stops the process of making red pigments.
- All of those colors in a leaf have always been there, it's just that they don't come out until
 conditions are right. Leaf colors depend on the sun. Leaves are full of chlorophyll, a natural
 chemical that makes them green. But when the leaves get less sunshine, chlorophyll isn't
 produced as much, making the green color fade, and allowing the natural color of the leaves to
 come out. So, really, leaves are naturally red, yellow, orange, and purple—the green is just
 dominant most of the year.
- If you read this, I bet you learned "something new" about fall!



Romans Bible Study!

The global message of Romans is that all people everywhere have free access to the riches of God's grace in Christ as they respond in faith to the gospel.

In his own Son, God has made a way for lost people to be restored to him—lost people whether they are Greeks or barbarians, wise or foolish (Rom. 1:14).

Paul's dominant concern in Romans is salvation—God's reconciliation of the world through the cross of Jesus Christ.

In Christ, God is working to reconcile all people to himself, to reconcile people to one another, and to redeem the created order from the evil forces of sin, death, and decay.

The intent is that this particular class be an on-line class only! So, watch for further details, it will be posted on the church's FACEBOOK page.

Constitution Ad-Hoc Committee

It is a learning process. Most people do not have constitution savvy. We have made mistakes along the way. We have learned some new things. We started out updating to the 2016 Constitution. As of now, we are working on the 2019 Constitution. The church-at-large hopes to present another "new edition" to a 2025 Constitution. They tell us it is an easy upgrade once you do all the hard work.

So, we have discussed all 20 chapters in detail. We have gone line by line on more than one occasion. We discussed words. We discussed semantics. We discussed the meanings of words.

We can tell you this, it is not easy going through "the constitutional process."

The Congregation will have every opportunity to weigh in. This is not being done in a vacuum. You will get a copy. You can read every word for yourself.

Much of the document cannot be changed or altered in any way. This is not just All Saints Constitution but is the Constitution of the entire ELCA.

They dictate a lot. There are very few changes that a congregation can make to the document. The Synod will have to approve our document...word by word. It must agree with the ELCA GUIDELINES.

So, once we are ready, we will again attempt to submit document number 2 to the Synod for their approval. If it comes back to us, we start over again. If what we have done meets with their approval, it goes to the council and to the congregation. There is a ratification process. We WILL keep you informed every step of the way.

The members of the Ad-Hoc Constitution Committee are Kerry Howard, Sara Jolitz, Elaine Kleinhans, Jayne Murnane, Timothy Jackalone, and Pj.

We've got to get this thing done; the clock is ticking.



Parking Lot Resurfacing...

The question was recently raised "HOW can we afford to have our parking lot resurfaced if there is a spending moratorium going on? (Good question!)

Well over a year, if not two years ago now, we had our first bake sale for the parking lot. That established "a fund." Some members have been giving monies to the parking lot fund. (Envelopes are available in the narthex area!) The account is growing! (We're not there, yet!) Even the youth of the church have stepped forward and offered monies from their account to help pay the cost. So, these monies are all being "raised." They are not from the church budget but are monies that were raised for "a specific purpose." The council can only spend that money that are a normal part of keeping the church going. (You know, the normal, everyday bills, salaries, lights, sewer, paper, ink, insurances, etc.) Because of the amount of traffic in a regular week's time, we have requested that MONDAYS are the best days for resurfacing, thus giving the parking lot time to cure and harden.

It is something that NEEDS to be done. It is NOT a frivolous expense at all. No one wants to spend money on a parking lot. But ours is in bad shape, in need of some much-needed repair work.

To NOT repair and resurface is only going to cost more money down the road.

Just so you know, one bid suggested we scrap the present parking lot altogether, start over and redo it all, at a cost of well over \$100,000.00.

The cost of \$12,000.00 seems MUCH MORE within our reach at this time.

We just received an update: The Parking lot will be closed September 18 & 19, 2023! They will come in to do the work and paint the following day! Please make a note! Thanks!

School Supply Donations





From the Kitchen of Saint Ruth

(Mother of PJ)

Puff Kringle

Ingredients:

- 1 cup flour
- 2 tbsp water
- ½ cup butter

Cut butter into flour until mixture looks like corn meal. Add water. Pat on cookie sheet ¼' thick about 2" wide; either 2 sticks 10" to 12" long or a circle like Kringle.

- 1 cup boiling water
- 1 cup flour
- 1 tsp Vanilla
- 3 eggs (1 at the time)
- ½ cup butter

Add all ingredients to hot water except eggs. Stir vigorously. Add eggs once at the time beating well between additions. Spoon this mixture on top of the first mixture. Run knife along center so there is an indentation for jam which will be added after baking. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour. Cool. Put jam or preserves in the middle of the baked Kringle. Drizzle with frosting.

For the Frosting

- ½ cup sifted powdered sugar
- ¼ cup vanilla
- 1 tsp hot milk

*Hint – If taken out when done, the puff will fall but will taste like a filling. If left after baking in the oven (turned off) with door open for 15 minutes, it will be dry and crispy.

Mix together and drizzle off the spoon.
