Comment Article:

Today three billion people around the world still identify as followers of Jesus.

The message he brought has spread to Europe, Asia, and every other continent.

The chances of that happening without "the jolting event" we celebrate as Easter are vanishingly small.

Before his resurrection, Jesus' few followers were denying him and hiding from the temple police. Even afterward, Thomas doubted until he saw proof in flesh and scars. Something happened to give the disciples a glimpse of Jesus' cosmic view.

At the end of that poignant last supper described in John 13-17, Jesus prayed for all who would follow.

"My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me **through their message**, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me, and I am in you.

May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me."

How are we doing, we Jesus followers in the twenty-first century?

We should be known for our unity and our confident hope, for we "are not of the world any more than I am of the world," as Jesus prayed.

If we truly believe Jesus has risen, and let that reality soak in, it should help calm fear and anxiety.

To the watching world, followers of Jesus should **stand out** as peacemakers: "bridge" people committed to love, not despise, our opponents—even our enemies.

So, the question remains, do we stand out and what are we standing out for?



The Bishop is Coming!


The Rev. Paul D. Erickson, Milwaukee, was reelected on May 21 to a six-year term as bishop of the Greater Milwaukee Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election was held during the synod assembly, May 20-21 at the Italian Community Center in Milwaukee. The assembly was also available online.

The bishop was reelected on the fifth ballot, with 215 votes to 100 votes for the Rev. Michelle Townsend de Lopez, pastor of Cross Lutheran Church in Milwaukee. A total of 158 votes were needed for the election.

Before becoming bishop, Erickson served as director of Agora, a ministry helping to develop lay leaders for immigrant and multicultural congregations in Minnesota and South Dakota, in St. Paul, Minn., from 2014 to 2016. He served as assistant to the bishop for evangelical missions in the Saint Paul Area Synod from 2008 to 2014.

Erickson earned a Bachelor of Arts from Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, Minn., in 1983, a Master of Divinity from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago in 1989, and a Doctor of Ministry in congregational mission and leadership from Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minn. in 2012. Gustavus Adolphus is one of 26 ELCA colleges and universities. The Lutheran School of Theology and Luther are two of seven ELCA seminaries.

We have a MEET & GREET scheduled with Bishop Paul Erickson of the Greater Milwaukee Synod of the ELCA on Sunday, April 28th, following our morning's liturgy! Come and meet him!

A poor farmer near Jerusalem owned a donkey far too small to do much work at all. He felt that he couldn't afford to feed a worthless animal like this, one that could do him no good whatsoever, so, at the supper table, he told his family that he was going to kill the donkey. His children, who loved the little donkey, begged him to sell it rather than harm it. But the farmer said, "It's wrong to sell an animal that can't do a good day's work."

Then his oldest daughter suggested, "Father, tie the donkey to a tree on the road to town, and say whoever wants it may take it for nothing." And the next morning, that's what the farmer did. Soon, two men approached and asked if they could have the donkey. "It can carry almost nothing," the farmer warned them.

"Jesus of Nazareth needs it," replied one of the men. The farmer couldn't imagine what a great teacher would want with such a worthless donkey, but he handed it over.

It was then that the shadow of the cross fell upon the shoulders and back of the donkey, and there it stayed. Not all, but some donkeys have borne the sign of the cross on their backs since that very day.

If anyone is interested in "helping out the cause" please stop and have a conversation with Dan.





According to a survey conducted by BlackHawk in 2021, over 83% of American consumers are willing to give and receive gift cards over physical gifts.






