

Comment Article: The Pondering Servant of the Lord



I was thinking about Jesus as the Suffering Servant of the Lord...and out of nowhere it hit me, his mother was "the Pondering Servant of the Lord."

Now that is NOT TO SAY that Jesus didn't do his fair share of pondering...because I imagine he pondered, thought and brooded, a lot.

Like mother, like son, and I snickered to myself...

Both of them had their share of struggles. And a life-journey that laid before them.

I would imagine, at some point, Mary looked forward to her wedding day, as most Hebrew girls did. She probably looked forward to settling down with Joseph and leading a quiet, normal, routine life. Was she ever in for a surprise...and a journey!

Everything changed, her whole life and existence changed that "one day" when God stepped into her life, vis-à-vis the angel, Gabriel, and told her she would be the mother of the Savior of the WHOLE WORLD.

And probably not knowing what she was even saying, she said, "I am the servant of the Lord." "May your word be fulfilled." Let it be...to me, as you have suggested!

From that moment on, she was all in, hook, line, and sinker. The rest would be history... talk about the adventure of a lifetime!

"Her journey" took her from Nazareth to the Hill Country, to Bethlehem, to Egypt, and back again to Nazareth again and on to Capernaum, and ultimately to Jerusalem. Where her son, went, so went Mary... She was "in," no matter where God's adventure would take her. We have to realize, at that time, most people NEVER VENTURED more than 7-10 miles from their place of birth.

Mary gave birth to her first-born son and wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a feed trough for animals. Joseph and she named "their son" – JESUS, which means he who saves, or he will save, or Yahweh saves...as directed by the angel of the Lord.

Next a rag-tag group of shepherds showed up without invitation, babbling on and on about a bright light in the nights sky (and no, it wasn't a drone) and a choir of angels. The angels spoke of the MESSIAH, "Christ the Lord."

Again, all Mary and Joseph could do, was to reflect upon ALL these strange things happening to them and around them...

Joy-filled shepherds! Babbling on and on...and more visits from angels...

What is going on here?

Poor Mary continued pondering...and again would be interrupted, by "Wise Men" from the East, dreams of Joseph and more weirdness....

They all but barely escaped a massacre by the local king and later she would follow her son at a distance...and see how people responded or didn't respond to him.

She worried and was concerned about his safety. She suffered right along with him. I think she followed him, in the event that he might need his mother.

She was present at the wedding in Cana in Galilee, no doubt the relative of a family member... She placed herself among the other women, who followed him...and she followed him all the way to Jerusalem, to the foot of his cross.

After his resurrection she was with him still, still by his side until he ascended...and then, with his disciples...from that point on...

I assume all this time she was still pondering, still trying to wrap her head around all that had happened, and all that was occurring.

I wonder if she ever regretted her decision...if she ever regretted the journey...

Christmas Eve/Day has come and gone...but the Season continues on through January 6th...

I wonder how many of us would/do take God at his word...no matter what our circumstances...and just how good are WE at FOLLOWING?

How many of us say "YES" to God? How many of us say "NO" to God on a regular and ongoing basis...

Are you a ponderer? A servant? Or do you continue to keep him at a safe distance? It is all stuff to continue to ponder upon...




The Epiphany of Our Lord Three Kings Day Feliz dia de Reyes (Happy Epiphany!) January 6th, 2025 The Three Magi


See Matthew 2. 1-12


Council Capsules

- Council approved a motion to cancel liturgy on Wednesday, January 1st.

In the early church...

different celebrations took place at different times, in different places. Worship celebrations were fluid. Changeable. Dependent on locale and local tradition.

In the early Church, Christians, particularly those in the East, celebrated "the advent of Christ on Jan. 6" by commemorating "Nativity, Visitation of the Magi, Baptism of Christ, and the Wedding of Cana" all in one feast of the Epiphany.

By the fourth century, both Christmas and Epiphany had been set as separate feasts in some places. At the Council of Tours in 567, the Church set both Christmas Day and Epiphany as feast days on Dec. 25 and Jan. 6, respectively, and named the 12 days between the feasts as the Christmas season. And thus, it was established!

Over time, the Western Church separated the remaining feasts into their own celebrations, leaving the celebration of the Epiphany to commemorate primarily the visitation of the Magi to see the newborn Christ on Jan. 6.

Meanwhile, the Eastern Churches' celebration of "Theophany" celebrates Christ's baptism and is one of the holiest feast days of the liturgical calendar.

For the Western Church the Baptism of Our Lord, is the Sunday after the Epiphany.

You can have your checking/saving account charged, or you can have your credit/debit card charged.


For those of you who always forget to use your "giving envelopes," this is a simple and easy way to contribute to the support of YOUR CHURCH.

Sojourner Family Peace Center has helped 10,000 clients this past year- providing families affected by domestic violence achieve safety, justice and well-being.



French Coffee Cake

Ingredients:

- ¹/₂ cup shortening
- 1 part butter
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 3 eggs
- 2 cups flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 pint sour cream

Directions:

Cream together the shortening, sugar, and vanilla. Sift dry ingredients together and add to creamed mixture alternate with sour cream. Spread half batter in greased 9x13 inch pan. Sprinkle with half of the topping. Cover with the rest of batter and cover with remaining topping. Bake for 35 minutes at 350 degrees oven. Enjoy!
