Comment Article: In the midst of two seasons... in the midst of two worlds

It is the season of Lent. The Season of Easter is looming. We are caught in the middle...both will be celebrated in the month of April.

Lent 2025 has been somber, darker than most. The emphasis has been on the "traditional agonies" associated with Lent: Ashes for repentance, Jesus praying in Gethsemane, The Pillar of Scourging and Flagellation, the Crown of Thorns, The Cross of Crucifixion, and the Crucifixion itself. Dark. Heavy. Some may even say it is a bit theatrical. But it is what it is. It happened.

And it happened to Jesus.

The handing over, the quick nighttime trials, the scourging (whipping), the beatings and taunting, being slapped and spit upon...and then being forced to carry his own cross bar, on which he would be crucified.

The scriptures talk about him stumbling and falling under the weight of the cross.

We hear about the women of Jerusalem weeping and wailing for him. And then, Good Friday. Followed by the extreme solemn time of HOLY SATURDAY.

The Rabbi dead. Hopes dashed. Dreams gone. Too horrendous to even think about.

And then, there is the JOY of EASTER SUNDAY MORNING, the EMPTY TOMB, the ANGELIC VISITORS, and the announcement by women of the RESURRECTION TO NEW LIFE.

We are caught between these two worlds, these two celebrations, both of which are worthy of our celebrating, remembering and our prayerful concern.

Meanwhile life is happening all around us...at a quickened pace...Young kids joy riding at excessive speeds, people in need of food, people being shot and murdered in the streets, sex trafficking happening on the 1-94 corridor.

Drug overdoses happening routinely, young people losing their lives for a one-time thrill...people are scared, a lot of confusion confronts many, not knowing where to turn or even what to do...

And somehow, as people of faith we must respond to all of it. Or to a part of it, Or to that which we can. We must be a presence. We are here for everyone. (No small order, by the way!)

The church, the people of God, the people of faith and hope, must act, where we can. Do what we can. Help out where we can. Be the church to a fallen and falling world.

I believe we each have such a role to play. There is something for each of us to do.

Lend an ear, listen, lend a shoulder, care, support, correct, pray, reach out, teach, be the example, guide, give as you are able, do what you can, where you can.

Lord knows, there is plenty of work surrounding each of us and all of us. We have neighbors in need. Neighbors in crisis. Heck, some of us have families in crisis and family members in need. The church has always responded to those in need.

And in the midst of the world, as it is, we must cling to our own faith, that is within us. Hang on with everything you've got. Sometimes, it is a rough ride. And sometimes rougher than others...

You know, thank God for our faith. I do not know how people do it without a strong, viable faith. How do they cope...how do they get through...without it. And why would you want to?

The church has always been in this position, this is nothing novel or new. The scripture talks about us between two worlds, in and not of...while we are here, we must do what we can. And we are in between two seasons of the church year, as well. For now, it is still Lent, but ah, Easter is coming...

A HOLY WEEK RUNDOWN OR ITINERARY



Holy Week begins on Palm (or Passion) Sunday and ends on Easter Sunday at the first light of day.

On Palm Sunday, Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey to the shouts of the crowd. This is known as the triumphant ride into Jerusalem.

On Monday, Jesus drove the money changers out of the temple.

On Tuesday, he dealt with the questions of the priests ("By whose authority . . .?") and taught the people in parables, warning them against the Pharisees and predicting the destruction of the temple.

The Scriptures do not record anything for Wednesday. Traditionally the church has used the term "SPY WEDNESDAY" and this day has been set aside for the dealings on the side, made by Judas Iscariot in an attempt to "hand him over" to the authorities…you remember, for thirty pieces of silver. Nice, huh?

Then come the Three Great Days, set aside since the fourth century as a unit marking the beginning and the heart of the church year.

Thursday was the day of Unleavened Bread on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. This was the day when Jesus washed his disciples' feet and "took bread .. ." saying, "Do this in remembrance of me."

On Friday Christ was crucified.

Saturday evening, counting as the Jews did from sundown to sundown, began the first day of the new week, the day of resurrection.

Holy Week concludes with the celebration of the resurrection.




Did You Know?

- : That, Shrove Tuesday or Fat Tuesday is not a part of the Lenten Season?
- : The first day of Holy Week is Passion Sunday, also known as Palm Sunday!
- : The last day of Holy Week is Holy Saturday.
- : Holy Week always occurs the week before Easter.
- : That MAUNDY THURSDAY comes from mandatum, meaning command.
- : Some churches celebrate the HARROWING of HADES...any guesses?
- : Some churches celebrate LAZARUS SATURDAY...again any guesses?
- : Maundy Thursday celebrates the LAST SUPPER.
- : Maundy Thursday also celebrates the WASHING OF FEET.
- : What is the new commandment given on Maundy Thursday?
- (How are you doing with that, by the way?)
- : What is the one day a year, when the EUCHARIST is typically not celebrated?
- : WHY?
- : Why is the sanctuary lamp extinguished? And on what day?
- : Of course, you have heard of SPY WEDNESDAY? What is that all about?
- : Have you ever heard of CLEAN MONDAY, PURE MONDAY, GREEN MONDAY, MONDAY OF LENT? (Why not?)
- : WHO conspired to betray Jesus and on what day traditionally is it celebrated?
- : What is the "CRY OF THE WHOLE CONGREGATION" and on what day is it celebrated?
- : What day is Sabbatum Sanctum celebrated on?
- : IF a Christian church were to have a special liturgy during Holy Week, which day would they typically pick?
- : Have you ever been to an EASTER VIGIL? (What is "the best time" to do an Easter Vigil?)
- : What is the significance of lighting a new fire?
 - : When is the Paschal Candle changed and marked?
- : When is the church stripped and what does it represent?
- : Have you ever heard of BLACK SATURDAY? What about the JOYOUS SATURDAY? Or the SATURDAY OF LIGHT?
- Lucy, you've got some studying to do…

The Three Great Days or the Triduum



Since the 300's these days have been known by various names: The Triduum, The Paschal Triduum, The Easter Triduum, The Holy Triduum, the Three Days, and The Great Three Days, etc.

What's a triduum you ask? Good question.

Triduum is Latin and simply means "three days."

From the fourth century on, Triduum has reflected the three days that Jesus laid in the tomb...from Good Friday to Easter Sunday.

From there the Triduum took on a life of its own.

In most churches this is to be a serious time of prayer...the FAITHFUL are supposed to spend extra time in prayer and in reflection.

It is also a time of fasting. There are some people who fast from Good Friday to Easter Sunday morning. The first food of the new week is the Body and Blood of Christ.

These days are solemn, quiet, strangely different.

Sometimes you will note even the weather seems to cooperate, cloudy, overcast, darker than normal.

Council approved the following matters at the March 18th regular meeting:

- Council approved a motion to remove the word "optional" from the liturgy signup sheet.

- Council agreed to table the discussion and approval of a noisy offering until after Easter.

 meeting and plan to attend the meeting even if it is not a full council meeting.
- Council approved a motion to have a spending moratorium (not spend above what is necessary and must be within budget).
- Council approved a motion to approve Bill Elmore as a new member.
- Council approved a motion to hold 8 am and 10 am liturgies on Easter Sunday.
- Council approved PJ's planned vacation May 10-12 and the need to secure a substitute pastor for liturgies that weekend.



Treasurer's report

ANOTHER WAY TO CONTRIBUTE...

Certain IRA holders have the opportunity to make tax-free distributions from their IRAs to qualified charitable organizations (All Saints is a qualified charitable organization). For tax-free eligibility, the qualified charitable distribution must be sent directly from the IRA payable to the receiving qualified non-profit organization.

People who hold IRAs are required to take Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) each year beginning at age 73 - even if they don't need or want the funds. That same required minimum distribution increases the IRA holder's total taxable income. BUT - if you fill out the proper forms from your IRA distributor, those RMDs can become tax—free distributions to you if you designate ALL SAINTS as the recipient.


