

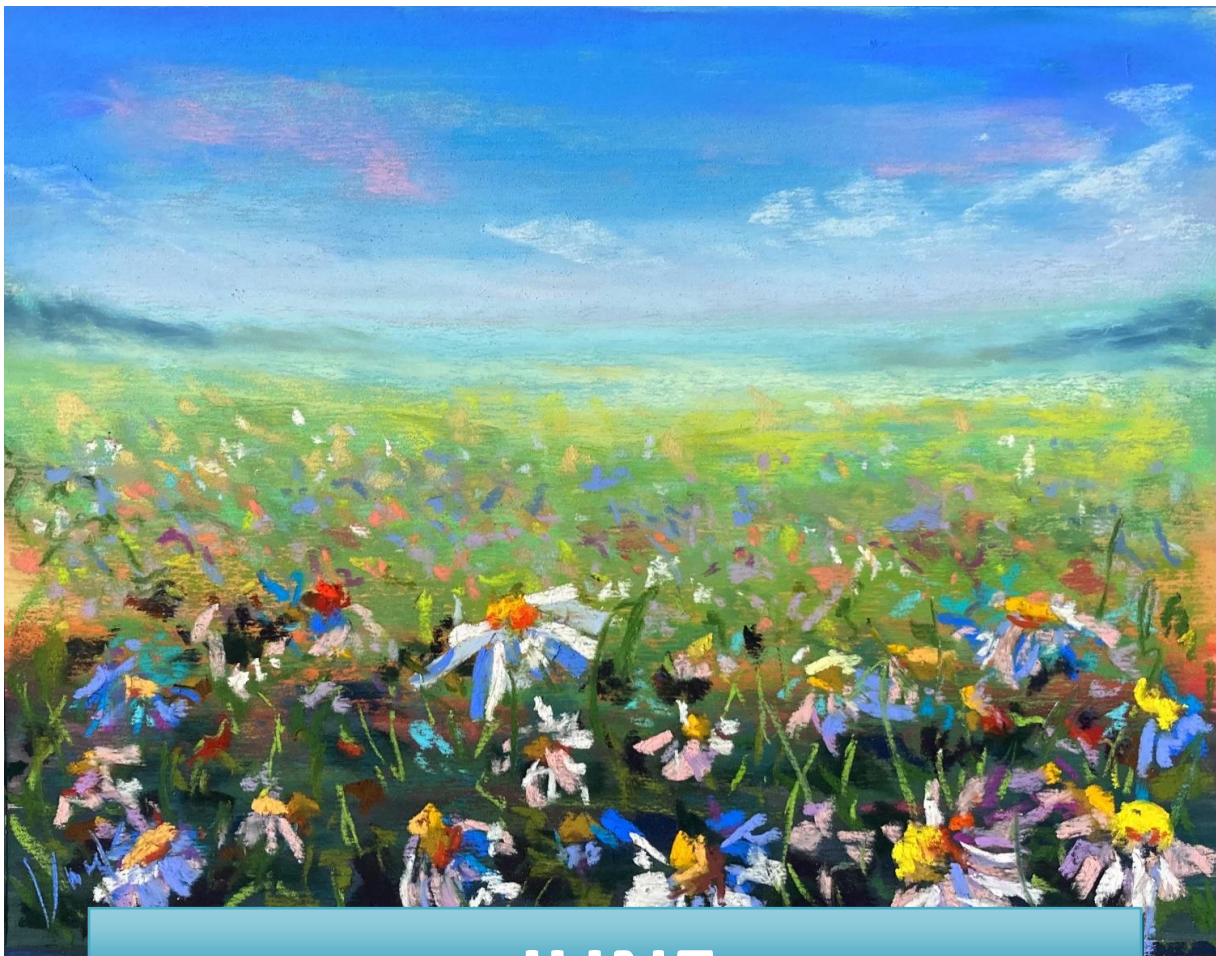

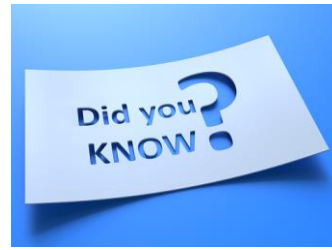

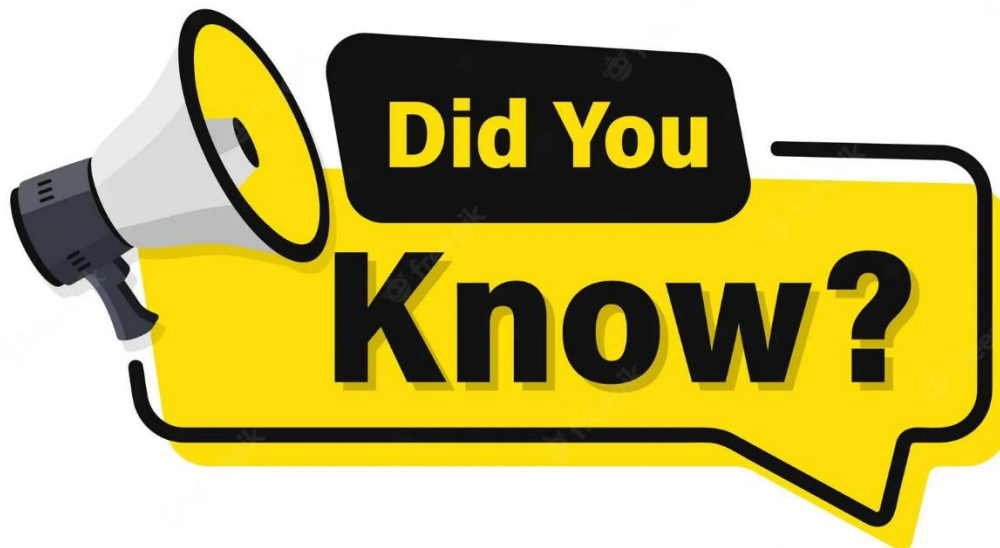

Did You Know?

- The Season of Pentecost, also known as Pentecostide, begins on Pentecost Sunday, which occurs 50 days after Easter, and lasts until the first Sunday of Advent.
- While the day of Pentecost is always red in color, the rest of the season is green, except for appointed "special days" like: Reformation, All Saints, A National Day of Thanksgiving, and any Saint days that might be celebrated.
- This season commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles, marking the birth of the Church.
- It emphasizes the Church's mission and the Holy Spirit's ongoing work in the world.
- The liturgical color for the Pentecost season is typically green, symbolizing growth and life.
- In the Roman Catholic tradition, Pentecost is considered the conclusion of the Easter season, transitioning into Ordinary Time.
- The Sundays following Pentecost are counted as "Sundays after Pentecost."
- Many Protestant denominations also observe the Season of Pentecost, focusing on the Church's growth and the proclamation of the Kingdom of God.
- The emphasis during this time is on the teachings of Jesus and the work of the Holy Spirit in the lives of believers.

You have fought the good fight, finished the course, and kept the faith. Your legacy of love and leadership will remain a part of this church forever.

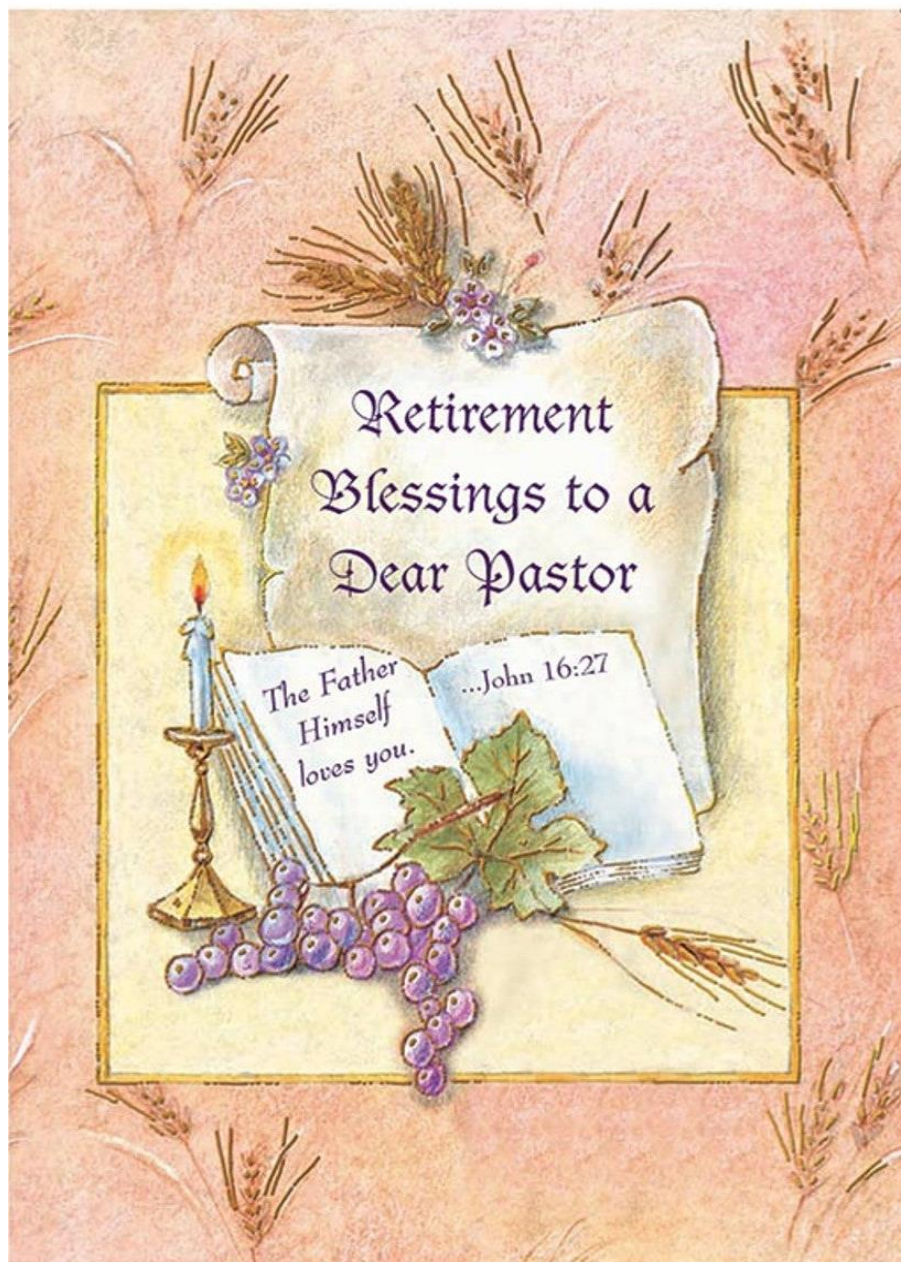

Our work will be to evaluate the needs of our congregation and translate them to the Greater Milwaukee Synod. Once that is complete, the synod will begin searching for a candidate who meets our needs at ASLC.

- **1/4 cup** chopped fresh tarragon
- **3 Tbsp.** chopped fresh dill
- **1 Tbsp.** Dijon mustard
- **8** croissants, halved lengthwise



Directions

1. Place chicken in a large pot of salted water. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer until the internal temperature on an instant-read thermometer reads 160°F, 10 to 12 minutes. Drain and shred.
2. Meanwhile, combine raisins and 2 tablespoons of tarragon vinegar in a small pot. Add water to just cover raisins. Bring to a boil, then remove from heat and let sit until plump, 14 to 16 minutes. Drain.
3. Combine chicken, mayonnaise, tarragon, dill, mustard, raisins, and remaining 2 tablespoons vinegar in a bowl. Season with salt and pepper. Spoon mixture onto croissant bottoms, dividing evenly. Sandwich with tops.
